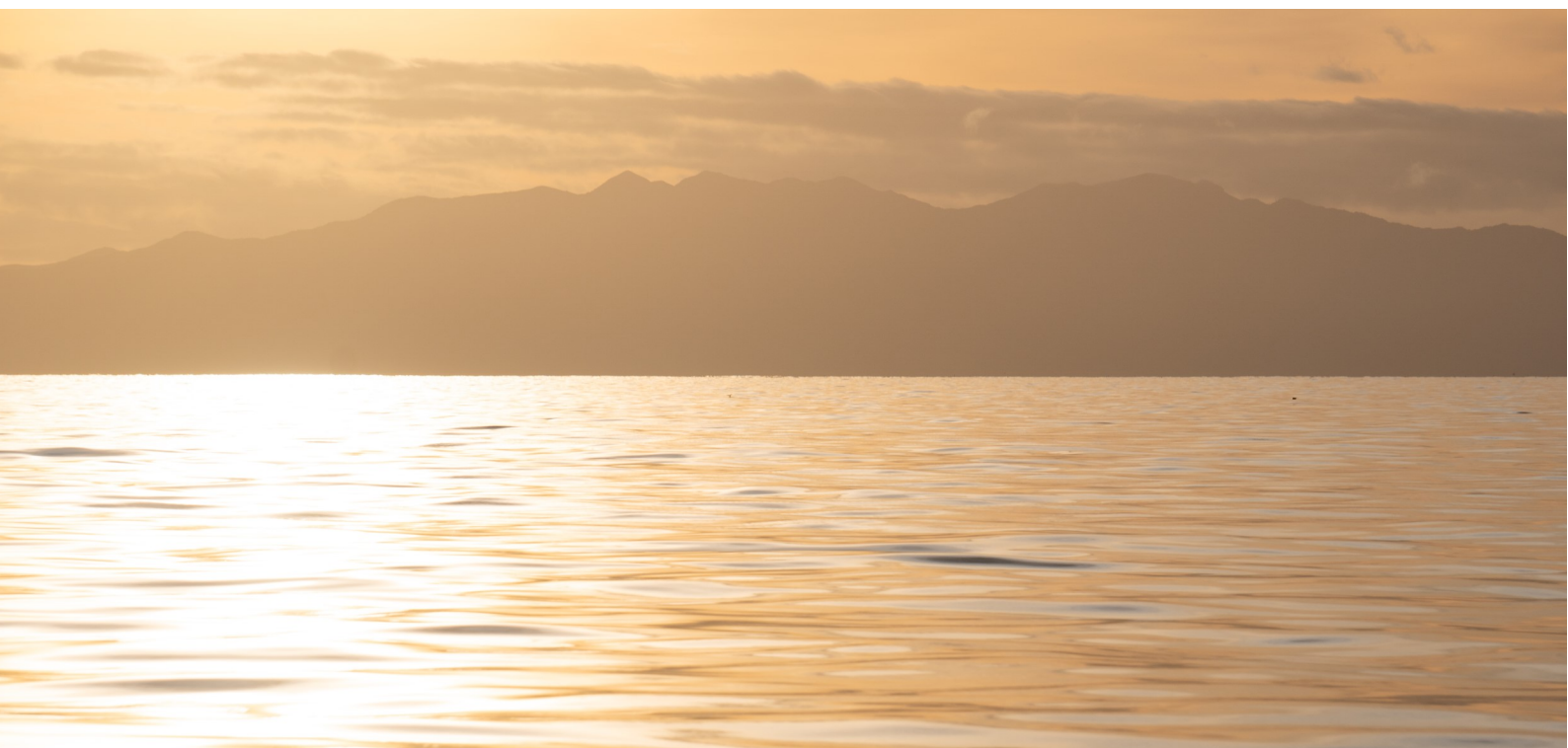
Objectives

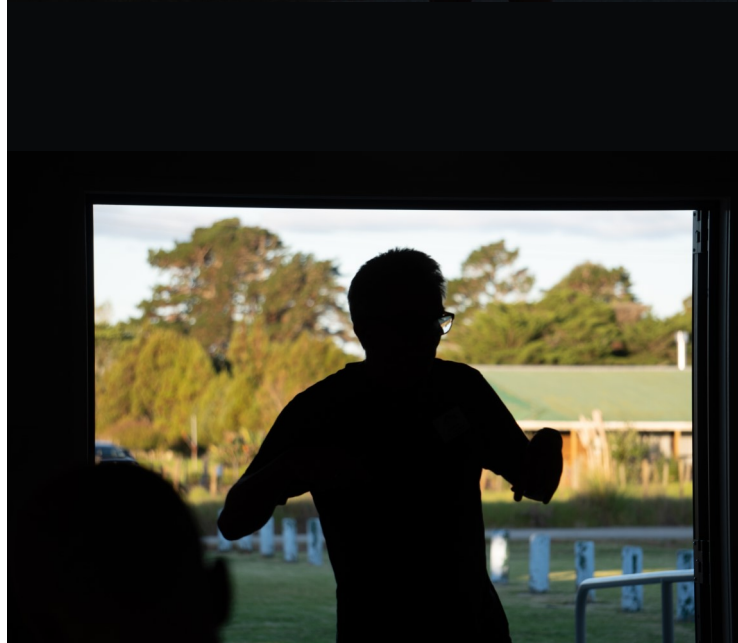
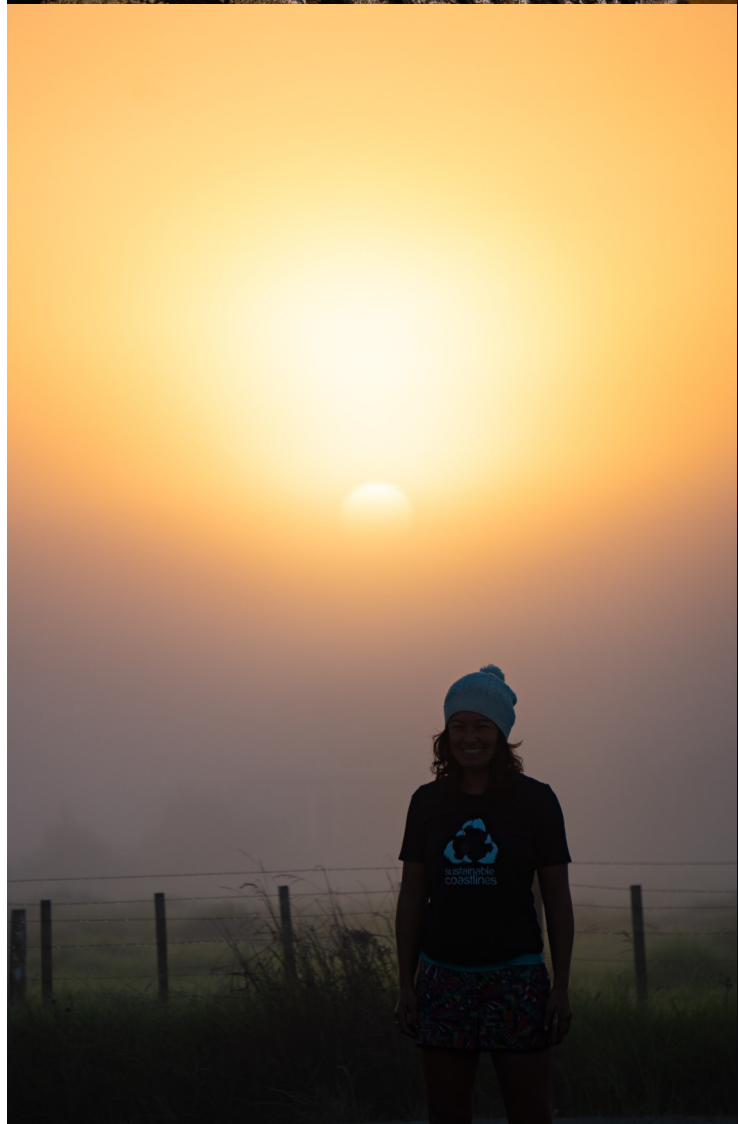
